- Q. Briefly explain what your job entails.
- A. The role of a Client Relationship Manager entails a very large number of tasks, to name but a few;
  - Preparing and organising Board meetings for which I, or another member of my team,
    would write the minutes.
  - Maintaining company registers
  - Liaising with investors on subscription, due diligence, drawdowns and distributions and general queries
  - Liaising with Fund Managers and Directors on investments and the general running of the Funds which my team administer.
  - Working with accounts team on audits and accounts distributions.
